What kind of city is "Choshi" where Chiba Institute of Science is located?

From Narita airport to Choshi station, it takes one and a half hours by train. Facing the Pacific Ocean and having the biggest river in Japan (Tonegawa river) in the north side of the city, Choshi is blessed with a natural environment. The city ranks as the place of the biggest landing of fish in Japan, and is also famous for soy sauce production. Affected by black current, its oceanic climate is mild and humid throughout the year, and rarely snows in winter. It has numerous places where people can experience the history of the earth, including a 200 million old stratum; the whole city of Choshi being certified as a Geopark. A magnificent view of the Pacific Ocean spreads in front of the CIS campus. The 40 meters high sheer precipice "Byoubugaura" (National Site of Scenic Beauty) stretches into the ocean where you can experience the impressive sight of it being dyed by the flaming sunset.

In the Intensive Japanese Language Program, students will acquire strong Japanese language skills necessary to study at university. Students not only study but experience productive campus lives as they participate in circle activities or festivals with undergraduate students. Students of IJLP become members of Choshi International & Multicultural Association (CIMA), and have opportunities to participate in events and volunteer activities organized by CIMA.

When students complete IJLP, instructors of the program will support students, finding their best academic path by carefully listening to their preference. Students of the Japanese language and culture course proceed to CIS and other affiliate universities, and students of the Automobile Course aim to enroll in a school to become automobile technicians.
